Store Steers to £2020 Store Heifers to £1840

We spent the back end of 2024 deliberating how it would be nigh on impossible to see the usual uplift in store cattle prices in the New Year as we have become accustomed to....but then what do we know about it? as the first Friday sale of 2025 saw all on offer move up another gear or two with a red hot trade and some eye watering returns right across the board. Top of the day was £2020 given for an outstanding Simmental bred steer (26m) from Tom Pascoe up from West Cornwall followed by a tremendous run of stores from Johnn Ridd and Family of Alverdiscott, North Devon who saw their very best, a pen of five stand out Charolais steers (21m) ease to £2000 apiece. The Ridd Family weren't finished there as they saw further pens of strong Limousin and British Blonde steers of a similar age rise to £1920 and more Charolais draw £1890. Derek Pyle in from Clyst Honiton chipped in with his usual smart, forward stores when parting with a mixed trio of British blues and British Blonde bullocks (30m) for £1905 whilst John Ridd and Family were back for more when seeing a brisk trade for a bunch of five rangy British Blues steers (22m) which went on to draw £1880 apiece. Younger Blue steers (16m) from Bob Colbear, Northlew looked as dear as anything sold on the day when rising to £1150 as did yearling Blue bullocks from William Hosegood and Family in from Zeal Monarchorum when reaching £1100. The latter also saw four yearling Friesian steers reach a head scratching £1040 a head. Pairs of smart Aberdeen Angus and Limousin steers (26m) ran to £1650 and £1570 respectively for Tom Pascoe followed by Hereford steers (22m) at £1110 for Graham Westaway of Poughill. The store heifer section was headed by John Ridd and Family with a couple of super Charolais bred sorts (25m) rising to £1840 a piece with their pair of Limousin females (28m) drawing £1580 each, although they were eclipsed by a sublime red Limousin heifer (29m) from Geoff and Nicky Arscott in from Chagford which came back at £1700. Graham Hawkins in from Thorverton saw a lovely run of shapely heifers rack up £1520 for a couple of British Blues (24m) followed by Aberdeen Angus of the same age at £1370 and £1360 whilst Fred Chanin who resides in the same parish saw cracking South Devon bred heifers (20m) reach £1245 for two. JC Palmer in from Chawleigh saw a brisk trade for a pen of three Holstein freemartins (26m) which picked up £1050 apiece whilst the better of the younger store heifers came from Roy White of Coleford when a single Hereford (14m) reached £900 followed his Simmentals (23m) also at £900. Just a few grazing cows on offer this week and what a trade they were too! Terry and Jenifer Arscott of Chagford sold a tank of a Charolais for £1680 whilst son and daughter in law Geoff and Nicky parted with a well-covered Salers cow for £1360, also, three strong South Devons from Eric Palmer up from Thurlestone realised £1410 a life. Eric also saw his three South Devon cull bulls draw keen demand when grossing £1150, £1400 and £1310.

Younger cattle looking an exceptional trade with yearling Devon crosses from J Blake of South Molton hitting £810 with Herefords off the same holding (9m) realising £760. Diepenbroek Farms of Searton presented dairy bred Angus steers (10m) which achieved £675 whilst the Darley Family of South Molton saw dairy Hereford cross steers (6m) race to £610. Heifers topped out at £900 for J Blake, selling Limousin cross yearlings with Blues and Charolais' of a similar ilk to £840 & £835 and younger Limousin heifers (9m) to £775. Paul Wakeham of Totnes sold South Devon heifers (10m) which levelled out at £700 whilst dairy bred stirks from Diepenbroek Farms saw Angus heifers attain £610 and £500 (9m) and Hereford heifers hit £480. RC Pratt down from Nomansland presented Blue bulls which achieved £860 (9m) whilst Besley Dairy of Wellington presented Swedish Red bulls which realised £500. Younger cattle in real demand. 13 ORPHAN LAMBS

A great start to 2025 in the sheep pens today with nearly 2700 head forward and sold seeing strong trades in all sections. Orphan's kicked things off well with the best weaned sorts at £70 for a trio from lan Pincombe of Kennerleigh who sold another pair at £65 and Alan Bickley of Puddington sold his well at £60 ahead of Michael Ayre of Thorverton with a young setting on sort at £40. All others from £15 to £35 to give an overall average of £46.

1912 STORE LAMBS

A very pleasing entry of 1912 store hoggs met with much demand from a packed alley of buyers that saw the better bred mediums looking the trade of the day with plenty of these sorts £120 to £137 with a few pens of killable hoggs up around £150 to a top of £161 for Brian Palfrey and Family of Stoodleigh, £156 & £148 for the Palk Family of Blagdon, £155 & £153 for David & Lynda Pellow of Sourton, £150.50 for Keith Rowell of Crockernwell and £150 for the Winzer Family of lyybridge. Short keep hoggs all in the late £130's and £140's with lesser bred mediums from £100 to £120 and several hill bred hoggs and tiny tots in the £70's, £80's and £90's all included in the overall average of £116.64.

85 GRAZING EWES & RAMS

The 85 grazers met a roaring trade too with the Winzer Family reaching £168 with their best ewe and £149 of a Greyface Dartmoor descendant as David & Sylvia Grant of Morchard Bishop sold a pair of Charollais crosses at £160 and ME Stevens & partners of Okehampton sold a pen of ewes at £150. Several rams about today, with the Baker Family of Kennford reaching £159 with their Dorset, Mary Yorke of Cadeleigh claimed £147 of a Zwartbles, Mark & Rita Dunn sold a crossbred well at £140 and Mark Northmore of Yelverton sold a lean Scotch tup very well at £88.

591 BREEDING EWES

Almost 600 in-lamb ewes for the catalogued January sale met with a decent trade for the mixed quality forward, all but three pens found new homes and they averaged in excess of £186 per head throughout. Andrew Mabin of Gara Bridge sold an eye-catching run of mid February lambers that saw Texel x Mules sell at £242 x3 and £240, the Walter-Symons Family of Churchstow sold Charollais cross ewes at £230 as well as others at £215 and Ollie Cleave of Bude sold his Texel crosses at £228. A super run of 3 crop NC Mules from Henry, Mark and Dan Johnson of Bridport started off at £202 and just went dearer and dearer selling three pens at £220, another at £219, two at £214 and numerous around £210 with an overall average of £208 for their 167 sold. Martins Farming of Dunkeswell sold March lambing Suffolk crosses at £220 & £210, £210 also for the Parker Family of Ashburton with two pens of 6T aged Mules and Liam Spry of Parracombe sold his best two pens of flock aged Mules at £205. More common sorts and later lambers, including a few unscanned from £150 to £190 with leaner and lesser things back at killing money but all included in that very respectable average of £186.40.

12 EWES & 20 LAMBS (32 LIVES)

Ewes and lambs remaining hard to find and trade staying hot, especially for the better sorts which are few and far between. A nice Dorset double from young shepherds Bert and John Steer of Ashburton sailed to £325 and £108/life with Alex Lawler of Nomansland selling similar at £318 (£106/life) as well as the top priced single at £255 or £127.50/life. Housed older ewe Dorset doubles at £278 for the Gutteridge Family of Weymouth who also had singles at £220 & £190 and a few second quality sorts around £70-80 per life and third quality sorts £50-£60 leaving us with an overall average of £234 per outfit or £96 per life.
